

UO COVID-19 Safety Regulations Notice

This notice should be given to courtesy and emeritus faculty, guests, and visitors to inform them of UO safety regulations and expectations.



COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement Regulation

All UO students and employees are required to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 prior to the start of the fall academic term. This public health measure at the UO will help protect our community. It also will limit campus disruptions and allow us to resume in-person instruction and activities.

While guests and visitors are not required to verify that they are fully vaccinated, they are expected to follow the intent of the regulation and help safeguard themselves and our community by:

- Being fully vaccinated before spending extended time on a UO campus; or
- Taking additional safety measures required for unvaccinated employees. This includes wearing face coverings indoors, distancing from others, and isolating or quarantining if you are exposed to or contract COVID-19.

Other Safety Precautions

The scientific data shows being vaccinated is the most effective way to safeguard yourself and your community against COVID-19. In addition to requiring COVID-19 vaccinations, we will continue to rely on other safety measures such as testing, case management and other public health precautions, as necessary.

Unvaccinated individuals will be expected to follow rigorous safety measures as outlined on the UO coronavirus website at <https://coronavirus.uoregon.edu/prevention>.

COVID-19 Regulations

The UO has enacted safety regulations that will be in effect until further notice as we continue to assess guidance from public health partners through summer. This guidance applies to all university employees, students, contractors, and visitors on university-owned or -controlled property at all UO locations.

- **Face coverings** are required indoors in all UO facilities regardless of vaccination status. Face coverings can be removed when alone in a room or cubicle, or in an area specifically designated for eating. Face coverings must fully cover the nose and mouth.
- **Daily symptom checks:** All individuals who will be on-site at any UO location are encouraged to perform a daily symptom screening prior to coming to campus. Individuals should stay home when sick and seek medical care as needed.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Because our knowledge and understanding of the COVID-19 virus continues to evolve, policies, plans, and guidance will be updated appropriately as more information becomes available. In the event that conditions worsen and the Oregon Health Authority and/or Higher Education Coordination Commission issue guidance on required or expanded remote work, this guidance will be adjusted.
